Lions in Service,

The New Year has started with a blast as we started August with the council of governors meeting in Kerrville, TX; the first cabinet meeting for 2X2 Lions convened on August at Waskom, TX; Leader Dog training was also held in Detroit MI; Zone I Region I zone meeting in Nash, TX and Lions World Service for the Blind orientation in Little Rock Arkansas.

Lion Sharon and I were able to make the trips to Kerrville, Waskom and Little Rock. The LWSB training

facility in Little Rock is the only training facility for the Blind and Visually impaired that provides Special Skills vocational training. Their theme this year is "Projection of Hope" does just that as this school provides training that will help make its clients productive members of society and independent individuals. It is real impressive to observe people with little or NO sight disassemble a small engine, use a computer, prepare meals and travel around the training facility without help. The services provided are greatly needed and as you all know education is expensive.

This facility is supported by the Lions Clubs in several states but the total money's received is not enough to cover all the expenses required to provide such a valuable service for those visually impaired interns/clients. LWSB is asking Districts and local Clubs to provide a little extra

effort in raising funds for this badly needed service.

ACTUAL TRAINING COST

Average length of stay at LWSB is Five Months

Training cost per Client = \$4,950.00 per month

Reimbursement by referring State = \$3,900.00

Un-Reimbursed Cost to LWSB is -\$1,050.00 (cost needs to help them remain in the black and operate under a balanced budget).

I am asking each club to consider a specific fund raiser project to help LWSB serve as a Beacon of Hope for its clients and continue to provide a sense of well being and independence for those that need it the most.

Lions have long been committed to programs that serve our youth. They are truly tomorrow's leaders. But they need us! I would like to encourage all Lions to support our youth, particularly this next month, as we focus on service to youth.

I'd like to share with you one youth program that is near and dear to my heart - [Lions Quest](#). I have seen its great impact worldwide, as well as in my home country. This is a program loved by youth, teachers and parents alike. Why is it so loved, you ask? Because it has real results, and it gives hope for the future.

Others know this, too. The Minister of Culture in Germany told me - after Lions Quest was implemented - that it



is not enough to deliver facts only in schools. We must also deliver ways to live and values for life.

And, this message is spreading. The Minister from Bhutan who attended our Lions convention spoke to me about wanting Lions Quest in their schools. Leaders are realizing the value of Lions Quest. Three additional

countries added the program last year - Bulgaria, Mauritius and the Philippines - bringing the program to 60 countries now. Next month we will be meeting in Colombia with Latin American leaders about expansion throughout the region. But there are so many other countries and communities where this program could make a difference.

Lions, now is our chance to make a name for ourselves as leaders in youth service. I challenge you to join me in global extension of Lions Quest.

LCIF Provides Disaster Relief

Lions Quest, Lions Clubs I'm sure that you have been following the news reports of the deadly flooding in Pakistan. My heart goes out to the 20 million affected by this disaster. As the flood waters and death toll continue to rise, Lions are committed to helping.

Lions have been providing assistance since the devastating flooding began July 22, and [LCIF is providing US\\$120,000](#) to help Lions in providing relief to their communities.

You know well that Lions Clubs greatest asset is our volunteers - you and 1.35 million Lions around the world. Wherever there is a need, there is a Lions club nearby, ready to respond with their hearts and hands. In the case of disasters, we are the first to offer help, and the last to leave.

I was moved by a [video](#) the Lions in Pakistan created. While it shows the effects of the disaster, it also shows hope - hope for brighter days ahead. This hope is because of Lions. They have put aside their own needs to help their neighbors, providing needed relief supplies and shelter.

We have received a lot of inquiries from

Lions asking how they can help. Lions in Norway have donated US\$81,000, District 105-I, Ireland, has donated US\$6,500, three clubs in District 201-W1, Australia, have donated a total of \$2,200, and Lions in England have informed me they are sending funds to LCIF in support of this disaster. You can also give hope through a [designated donation to LCIF](#) for Pakistan relief.

We are truly committed to long-term relief, and [Haiti](#) is one example where our work remains ongoing. The Lions of Haiti have done a great job given the wide-spread devastation and the local constraints that exist.

Six hundred Haitian families will move into new homes thanks to an initiative between LCIF, the Lions of MD III Germany, and HELP, an international non-governmental organization (NGO). This is the first of many [reconstruction projects](#) to receive support from LCIF thanks to the generous response from the international family of Lions following the devastating earthquake in Haiti.



Through the project, homes will be erected directly on a family's plot of land, thus avoiding the hardship of further displacement and any potential property disputes. The building of these homes is an important first step toward reestablishing normal life for families who lost their homes and so much more after the earthquake.

From Haiti to Pakistan, China to Tennessee, Lions and our foundation are rebuilding homes and lives.

'I Got My Glasses From Lions' So What's New?

The cover picture and lead story ('I got my glasses from Lions') in the September "Lion" could not have been more perfect for this month's TLERC newsletter topic. Read the story (pgs14-19) about the young boy on the cover, who received a new pair of glasses **46** years ago; or read how Lion George Walter received new glasses from a Lions club **56** years ago. If you read the stories about how Lions have been making such a huge difference in people's lives for decades, you have almost no choice but to ask: How can our Club help **MORE** children to see? I hope the answer is below.

"What is a Lions Club, if it's not somehow working on vision care? . . . And what Club doesn't somehow work on projects involving children? If you're like most Clubs, you do both. Personally, I've been involved with 3 clubs over 37 years that have literally spent hundreds of thousands of dollars putting new eyeglasses on children. Yet we didn't make a dent in the number of children who needed help. At anywhere from \$75 - \$125 for an exam, frames, & lenses, we just ran out of budgeted money too quickly. Frustrating? . . . You bet! Enter TLERC's (Texas Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center) lens laboratory and the new "Children's Eyeglass Program" that is available to any Lions Club. How does a brand new pair of glasses for \$14 sound? With a grant from Sight First II, TLERC

now has state of the art computerized lens cutting equipment that is capable of producing prescription lenses at a rapid pace. (Note: some specialty lenses are more costly, but glasses should range from \$14 - \$18/pair.)"

This is how I start a program when I am asked to present one to a District or Club, and the paragraph above is exactly what I put in last September's newsletter. However, the message in this paragraph is so important that it doesn't hurt to repeat it. Fellow Lions, if you are paying more than \$14 - \$18 for a pair of glasses, you are probably "under serving" your community. All Clubs have budget limitations, and if you are even paying as little as \$35 - \$40 for a pair of glasses, you COULD have "served" two or three times as many children.

If you already have the screening programs and doctor examination processes in place, you are ready to get started with TLERC's Children's Program; but if you do not, let TLERC help you get started. (Just give us a call.) However, after the initial screenings and exams are done, the problem has been the cost of having to buy the glasses. While many optometrists, opticians, and optical shops are doing a great

service by discounting glasses for Lions Club projects, because of overhead they can only go so far. With the TLERC program we will send you a supply of new frames for boys and girls, prior to your eye exam session with the eye doctor. Those children needing prescription glasses then select a frame. The Club sends the frame to TLERC with the prescription attached. TLERC's volunteer staff will send them back as quickly as possible with the prescribed lenses in the frames. That's it!

Don't wait. School has started and now is when the need for glasses really surfaces. If your Club or District wants to be "**Beacons of Hope**" to more children, please contact PDG Dave Hoopman (COO) or PDG Bob Edwards at our offices (2550 Flynt, Midland, TX 79701 - 432-683-3611). Don't forget to send all of your collected/used eyeglasses, prescriptions and frames for children's glasses, and regular correspondence to this address, and please consider becoming one of our "**Visionary Knights of the Blind**". Sunday Refreshment Stand: (4+ Lions needed) Handicap weeks 1:30-5 pm, Diabetic Weeks 12:30-4pm (around a \$100 investment for the club in expenses)

Sunday Dinner Picnic: (12+ Lions needed for 2 serving lines) Served at 6 pm all weeks (whatever expenses to fix food or purchase in town and served by Lions) (Special Menu requirements for Diabetic Weeks that must be followed – contact camp for details)

Friday Lunch Picnic: (12+Lions needed for 2 serving lines) Served at 12 noon during Handicap weeks (whatever expenses to fix food or purchase in town

and served Lions)

Friday Watermelon Picnic: (8+ Lions needed for 2 serving lines) Served at 3 pm during Handicap weeks (whatever expenses to bring melons or have the camp order produce and then invoice the club)

Friday Camper Dinner Picnic: (12+ Lions needed for 2 serving lines) Served at 5 pm every week (whatever expenses to fix food or purchase in town and served by Lions) (Special Menu requirements for Diabetic Weeks that must be followed – contact camp for details)

Friday Parent Dinner: (10+ Lions needed for 2 serving lines) Served at 5 pm in the Dining Hall for Diabetic Weeks only (whatever expenses to fix food or purchase in town and serve by Lions)

Friday Awards Night: (8+ Lions needed) must be at camp by 6:30 pm and stay through Awards which end around 9 pm (no expenses known)

The Summer Camp Schedule is officially set and is posted below. The weeks are marked handicapped (H1, H2, etc) and diabetic (D1 and D2). We also have a pilot program week with Down Syndrome Campers (Downs). Get with your club members and find a few dates that will suit your schedules and then

Peace Poster Contest

23rd Annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest

Vision of Peace



Sponsor a Lions International Peace Poster Contest and your club worldwide in sharing children's visions of peace with your community.

How the Contest Works

Lions clubs sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2010. Participating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "Vision of Peace."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Headquarters for the final judging. Entries are judged at all levels on originality, artfulness and portrayal of theme.

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

Awards

Artists of posters advancing to the final international judging are recognized as follows:

- **International Grand Prize Winner** receives a trip to the award ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations (subject to change). At the ceremony he/she will receive a cash award of US\$5,000 (or local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one being the winner's parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony. The award ceremony is scheduled for March 2011.
- **23 Merit Award Winners** each receive a cash award of US\$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.
