## Travels With District Governor Lynn



G'Day Lions:

It's good to be a Lion and live in the best district, 2 - X2, in Texas. I hope this newsletter finds all healthy and safe. I know the Lions of 2 - X2 are "serving" their communities to the best of their abilities. Keep up the good work.

I want to thank all the Lions who stepped up to become a club or district officer. I know many of the officers are new to their position, and I give you a special, "Thank You," for serving your club or the district. Please ask any fellow Lion to help you or to direct you to a Lion who has served in the same position. I know when you were installed your response was "I WILL" to the best of my ability, and I know you MEANT it. Each position has its own requirements and certain deadlines.

The club secretary is the KEY communication link between

the club, district and Lions International. It is important that all the correspondence be immediate, prompt, and appropriate. The secretary needs to learn the due dates for all reports and file them on time. This is a lot to remember for a secretary who has been doing it a long time, let alone a new secretary. I give a Big Special Thank YOU to all the Secretaries of 2 -X2 for the great job they are doing.

Just as a reminder the MMR'S and the Activity Reports are due monthly. Each secretary has his/her own password and username so he/she can file online. I know there are some clubs still doing the hand written report. If you are filing online it is due at the end of the month, while the handwritten ones are due to Lions International by the 20<sup>th</sup>. If I may make a suggestion for the clubs filing online, go in and file the day of your last meeting of the month. The hand written reports need to be mail so it arrives on or before the 20<sup>th</sup> and then send a copy to the Governor. Please do not wait until 10 pm on the last day of the month to file your reports.

In the month of September the total of reports filed was 13 out of 44 clubs. The filing of these reports is not to be taken lightly. I receive a report of the numbers of clubs that have or have not filed. If the reports are late or not filed at all, there will be repercussions for not only the club but also for the Governor. I hope that the number of clubs will be greater if not 100% for the month of November. I don't want to have to email, write a letter or place a phone call to club secretaries. If a club continues to fail to file the MMR'S and Activity Report I will have to take further actions. I have faith that all the secretaries will learn to file these reports on time.

The month of September was a good month for the Governor's visits. My travels took me to places I have never been before. I would like to thank the clubs I visited in September. They were New Boston Evening, Daingerfield, Nash and Wake Village. My schedule was revamped, and I plan on making a club a week. I will call or emailed the clubs for the upcoming month.

# LCIF



Lions, you are helping to save sight and prevent blindness, for people down the street, but also around the world. It doesn't matter that these are people we may never meet. They need us! And Lions roll up their sleeves and respond. I would like to encourage all Lions to participate in a sight project, particularly in October, as we focus on sight.

Just last week I attended the Special Olympics Europe/Eurasia Regional Games in Warsaw, Poland. There, we celebrated the 10<sup>th</sup> year of our Opening Eyes partnership with Special Olympics. At [this event](#) we screened the 200,000 athlete. Isn't this an impressive accomplishment in such a short time? This partnership is giving hope-hope for a brighter tomorrow and hope that these athletes will run faster, jump higher and throw farther.

At this event I took great pride in fitting a pair of glasses onto the smiling face of Tomasz, a badminton player from Poland. All of us experience what we call "the touching moments in life." You know what I mean. For me, one of these moments was to give these glasses to Tomasz. Due to the tremendous cooperation of Lions Clubs International and Opening Eyes, Tomasz's new glasses

helped him score gold in Doubles Badminton and a silver in Singles Badminton.

**Special Olympic Testimony:** *Aphiwe, a Special Olympics athlete from South Africa, was far sighted and unable to read in class. When he was*

*screened through the Opening Eyes Program, it was the first time he tried on glasses. Receiving glasses allowed him to read words and numbers in books for the*



*very first time. Because of Lions, Aphiwe is now a better student and athlete alike.*

October is also Lions World Sight Day, an opportunity to celebrate our many accomplishments through our SightFirst program. We've restored sight to 7.6 million people through cataract surgeries. Every one of these individuals has an improved quality of life, thanks to you. But we aren't content to stop there, are we? We must ensure their children and grandchildren will also have improved vision and the chance at a better life.

**Celebrate Lions World Sight Day:** Lions Clubs International will mark [Lions World Sight Day \(LWSD\)](#) in Osaka, Japan on October 7-

8. Lions members from District 335-B, Japan, will sponsor several events, marking the first time LWSD will be held in the country. A number of projects will be conducted through a SightFirst grant from Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF). Additional activities are planned locally and globally around LWSD to educate communities about the need to prevent blindness and preserve sight.

**Supporting Cataract Surgery in Mexico:** The Edith Walters and Kenneth E. Behring Operating Theater was inaugurated in August in the town of Guadalupe, Nuevo Leon, Mexico. The event marks the successful completion of the first project funded by the Global Health and Education Foundation (GHEF) through a US\$250,000 gift to LCIF. The clinic will provide free cataract surgery to 140 people monthly and is an integral part of a larger clinic campus that includes a diabetes clinic, substance abuse clinic, soup kitchen and physical therapy clinic.

Lions, I ask you to join me in making a commitment to continue, and expand, our efforts to save sight.

# Peace Poster Contest

23rd Annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest

## Vision of Peace



*Sponsor a Lions International Peace Poster Contest and your club worldwide in sharing children's visions of peace with your community.*

### How the Contest Works

Lions clubs sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2010. Participating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "Vision of Peace."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Headquarters for the final judging. Entries are judged at all levels on originality, artistry and portrayal of theme.

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

### Awards

Artists of posters advancing to the final international judging are recognized as follows:

- **International Grand Prize Winner** receives a trip to the award ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations (subject to change). At the ceremony, the winner will receive a cash award of 1,595,000 (local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one being the winner's parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony. The award ceremony is scheduled for March 2011.
- **23 Merit Award Winners** each receive a cash award of US\$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.

## Lions Club Have A New Filing Requirement

It's short, easy and electronic – it's the new E-Postcard and it's required by the IRS.

Don't throw away your tax-exempt status – be sure to file your e-Postcard.

- How do you know if your Lions Club has a filing requirement?

If you are a small tax-exempt organization that normally has annual gross receipts of \$25,000\* or less and does not have to file Form 990 or 990-EZ, you must file the e-Postcard (also known as 990-N). Please note that this is an IRS requirement.

- When is the e-Postcard due?

It's due by the 15th day of the fifth month after the close of your tax year. Lions

Clubs operate on a fiscal year, July 1

– June 30, and the e-Postcard will be due by November 15th each year.

- What information does your club need to provide on the e-Postcard?

- o a legal name and mailing address and any other names used,

- o a Web address if one exists,

- o employer identification number (EIN),

- o organization's annual tax period,

- o the name and address of a principal officer, and

- o a statement confirming the organization's annual gross receipts are normally \$25,000\* or less.

- What happens if you don't file?

You risk losing your tax-exempt status! Any Lions Club that fails to meet its annual reporting requirement for three consecutive years automatically loses its

tax-exempt status under the new law.

- Why is the IRS calling it an e-Postcard?

Because it's as simple as sending a postcard and it's electronic.

\* The IRS intends to increase the Form 990-N (e-postcard) filing threshold from

\$25,000 in gross receipts to \$50,000 in gross receipts, beginning with the 2010 tax year, filed in 2011.
