## LCIF



I once heard an African proverb that I will forever remember: the best way to help someone in need is to wipe their tears. Lions, we do this every minute of every day! Our hands are helping those in need, and the compassion in our hearts is wiping their tears. One way we are doing this is by improving the health and education of children worldwide.

Just last month, Margit and I were in Ethiopia and Madagascar to help launch our Lions-Measles Initiative pilot programs. In these countries Lions helped vaccinate nearly 10 million children. This is truly sensational!

Did you know that measles is the leading cause of vaccine-preventable deaths in children? Over the next three years, 1.7 million children will likely die from this disease, which also causes blindness. Lions, we can and we must stop this!

At a health center in

Imersituska, a rural village in Madagascar, I met Marie Louise Razafindrazanana, who brought her nine-month old son, Patrick, to be vaccinated. She knew all too well the dangers of measles, as she lost her daughter to the disease. I truly felt I was wiping her tears, but she gave me something in return - a smile of hope and gratitude. Her story echoes those that I heard in Ethiopia. But these mothers know that we Lions are giving their children hope for a long, healthy life.

Lions have long been committed to improving quality of life for children. Another way we do this is by improving their education and providing them with vital life skills. In



meeting with government officials in both countries, they pledged their full support to the measles program. But they were also very interested in starting Lions Quest in their country.

LCIF has joined with the Measles Initiative to launch the [Lions-Measles Initiative](#) pilot program in four African countries. LCIF and local Lions are supporting a worldwide effort to protect children from measles and strengthen routine immunization services. [View a video of the vaccination campaign in Madagascar](#) and view photos from [Madagascar](#) and [Ethiopia](#). Vaccination campaigns in Nigeria and

Mali will take place in January and February, and help even more children. The program is jointly funded by LCIF and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Launched in 2001, the Measles Initiative is a partnership - led by the American Red Cross, United Nations Foundation, U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, UNICEF and World Health Organization - committed to reducing measles deaths worldwide. The Initiative is currently focused on supporting the United Nations' goal of reducing global measles mortality by 90 percent (2000-2010).

Like so many other leaders worldwide are realizing, Lions Quest can and should be a key component to improving the general well being of our youth. Government can't do this alone. It takes all of us working together to really make an impact.

Moments like these also make me realize the significance of what our Foundation does for people in need, but there is so much more we can do. Please, Lions, let's continue to give hope to our youth for a healthier and brighter tomorrow by wiping away tears through our Foundation!

# Christmas: A Time of Giving

Christmas is the ultimate time of giving: Giving presents, giving help to the needy, or giving ourselves in service..... And what better gift could a “Knight of the Blind” give than the **Gift of Sight**? Through Sight First, the Texas Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center & the Lions of Texas give the gift of sight in many ways, but the most obvious and simplest way is to give someone a pair of glasses. A gift of glasses can change a person’s life.

Last month we discussed what happens to the “gifts” of glasses you send to TLERC in order to get ready to give them to those in need. This month we want to give you some ideas (that other Clubs have used & still use successfully) to collect used glasses. If your Club is not sending used glasses to **TLERC (2550 Flynt, Midland, Texas 79701)**, maybe one of these ideas will get you started:

- 1) Decorate a large trash can or metal drum for used glasses, and always have it at your fund raising events, like pancake dinners, etc. Over time people will learn to expect it & will bring their used glasses to your event.
- 2) With permission of course, set out small collection boxes at local retailers. Especially productive are pharmacies, eye doctor or optical

shops, funeral homes, Church offices or vestibules, & local hospitals. Look for places (like grocery stores) where people go repeatedly. Once they spot the box over time, they will eventually remember to dig those old pairs out of the nightstand. Remember to run your route regularly, since retailers do not want overflowing boxes that make their store look messy. Many clubs make their own wooden boxes, and cardboard boxes with graphics can be found through Lions International. **Oh by the way, if the managers of these retailers are not members, this is the time to ASK them to become a LION!**

3) Funeral homes may not be willing to put out a box, but if you talk directly to the Funeral Director, they may be willing to delicately ask the family for the deceased’s eyeglasses. It is comforting to know that their loved one can help another person even after death. **Oh by the way, if the Funeral Director is not a Lion, you got it –ask him or her to join!**

4) Find or make a weather protected container. Paint it Lions’ colors and paint on some graphics. If you have a clubhouse, put one out in front of it. Also, you might find a mall or strip shopping center that would allow you to place it on the corner of

the parking lot. Look for the malls that already allow collection boxes (like Goodwill). Again make sure you run your route regularly, so they don’t overflow or become trashy.

5) If you still have a door to door project like selling brooms, light bulbs, poinsettias, etc., then make it part of the pitch at every home to ask for used glasses. In fact, one club I’ve heard of, makes it their project just to go door to door to collect used glasses - they aren’t selling anything. **Oh by the way, if the person at the door isn’t in their Club, they invite them to a meeting!**

These are just a few easy ideas to get you started, and once you get into collecting, contact TLERC, so we can provide you training to go the next step (the “first sort” discussed in detail last month) for TLERC. This saves us time and you money, because it reduces the shipping weight. Maybe then you will progress to the next step. Through TLERC we can train your Club (or District) how to use a lensometer to read the prescriptions of the glasses you collected, then to sanitize and bag them. Learning these basics about prescriptions is the beginning of what you need to know to set up an adult eye clinic.
